

environmental policy

We recognise that our business operations have an impact on the environment and are committed to minimising any potential harmful effects wherever and whenever possible.

We will actively seek to reduce the consumption of raw materials and will operate a policy to recycle.

We will identify and manage any risks or hazards whilst seeking to prevent pollution and limit the amount of harmful emissions.

We commit to procuring and manufacturing to meet the requirements of our certification with PEFC (Programme for the Endorsement of Forest Certification) and FSC (Forest Stewardship Council).

Wherever possible we will use materials that carry chain of custody certification and will not knowingly use species of timber that are prohibited or are from illegal sources.

We will ensure that our suppliers have similar Environmental Policies and the materials they supply are from responsibly managed forests.

As part of our continual awareness we have developed this policy to clarify our objectives towards sustainable environmental improvement.

In this way we aim to help every employee to understand and implement the relevant aspects of this policy in their work through regular communication of objectives, action and achievement.

To minimise the impact of our operation on the environment we will:

Meet and where appropriate exceed the requirement of all relevant legislation, where no regulation exists we will set and work to our own standards.

Seek to reduce consumption of materials in all operations, re-use rather than dispose of whenever possible and promote recycling and the use of recycled materials.

Reduce wherever practicable the level of harmful emissions.

Market products that are safe to use and manufactured from materials that can be re-used, recycled or disposed of safely.

Work with our suppliers to minimise the impact of their operations on the environment through an environmentally aware purchasing policy.

Support an open dialogue concerning environmental issues with clients, employees and the public.

Seek to prevent pollution.

Identify and manage risks and hazards.

The material we use

The products we supply are predominantly manufactured from timber, a natural organic material, grown and harvested in carefully managed forests.

In the natural production of the material, the growing trees not only absorb dangerous carbon dioxide gas but also humidify and cool the ever warming climate.

When the product has served its purpose and needs disposing of, the timber components are recyclable and biodegradable.
